SUBJECT: Consideration of Rezoning Request No. REZ-18-02, requested by Glandon Forest Equity, LLC to rezone a 2.53 acre portion of Tax Parcel No. 2-0082-0014A from RA (Rural Agricultural District) to CR (Rural Commercial District).

Project Description/ Research & Analysis

Existing Conditions & Background Information:

Rezoning in General

Glandon Forest Equity, LLC, represented by George Venters, is requesting to rezone 2.53 acres of a 21.74 acre parcel. To avoid a split zoning situation, which is when one parcel has 2 different zones, any rezoning approval needs to be initiated only upon recordation of an abbreviated plat based on the Exhibit map for Glandon Forest Equity surveyed by Jason Mizelle, PLS dated Nov. 30, 2018 attached to this staff report. The 2.53 acres is located directly in front of the Albemarle Plantation Property Owners Association (APPOA) boat trailer parking, across from the Plantation's construction entrance, and is mostly wooded. The subject property is an approximate rectangle that meets minimum lot size requirements. County water is available; private sewer is available with proper approval through the Washington, NC office of Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). The entire 21.74 acre parcel was previously designated as part of a Planned Unit Development (PUD) zoning classification before its vested interest expired. **Any use** in the CR column of our Zoning Ordinance Article 8, Table of Uses will be permissible if the rezoning is approved.

Excerpt of Zoning Ordinance Section 604. Intent of Zoning Districts:

A. <u>RA Rural Agriculture Zoning Districts</u>: The Rural Agriculture District is designed to reflect the pattern of development in rural Perquimans County. The intent of this district is to preserve and protect current uses and way of life and also to protect property rights. Home occupations of all types, even those of a commercial or industrial nature may be permitted provided the home occupation use is clearly subordinate to the use of the principal residential structure for residential purposes and limitations are prescribed through the Conditional Use Permit process to prevent incompatible processes normally associated with commercial or industrial uses from adversely impacting adjacent or nearby residential uses or districts. A secondary temporary dwelling for family hardship circumstances may be requested as provided in Section 1002, and additional dwellings may be added for every ten (10) acres of land, pursuant to Section 505. (See Articles V, VII and VIII for permitted uses and area and yard requirements.)

<u>I. CR Rural Commercial Districts:</u> The District is established to reflect the wide array of

businesses existing in rural areas of the County. The District permits virtually all traditional small business uses and Conditionally permits more intrusive uses. (See Articles V, VII and VIII for permitted uses and area and yard requirements.)

Potential Future Zoning Permit:

Dollar General may be considered 'Retail Sales & Other Establishments not Otherwise Listed' in the Table of Uses which means, if applied for, a zoning permit would be granted via an administrative decision by Planning Staff. Using Zoning Ordinance Section 704, the principal structure would require a 40 foot setback on the front, 20 foot setback on the rear and 10 foot setback on the interior side and 20 foot setback on the side next to the gravel drive. According to Section 1909 'Minimum Parking Requirements', one (1) parking space for each four hundred (400) square feet of gross floor area is needed.

Based on the submitted site plan more than enough parking spaces are proposed. The building will be 70' X 130' for a total of 9,100 square feet. Landscaping will be required per Article 18 of Perquimans Zoning Ordinance. Submitted signage will need to decrease its total cumulative square footage; applicant is currently working with Planner Money on this. Sign(s) will be yellow but have no internal illumination. Signage above the front doors will have gooseneck lights that shine down on it from above, as will a monument sign in the parking lot area. Applicant has consulted with the landowner and a panel of roughly 30 members of APPOA about store appearance, lighting and signs.

December 7th and 10th Planner Money spoke with Mr. David May, Regional Supervisor of Water Quality Regional Operations for NC DEQ, who oversees wastewater permit # WQ0001817 of Albemarle Plantation. Mr. May explained that a retail store is considered domestic waste like a house and was confident that employee restrooms will pose no problem to the existing wastewater system. He cautioned that the applicant check the wording of the permit to determine exactly what the 'defined service district' is to verify that outside entities may hook on.

I reiterate, even though we are focusing on a Dollar General store at this time, <u>full range</u> of land uses must be considered for a rezoning.

Regulations and Procedure

Potential Schedule for Public Hearing(s): October 22, 2018 Glandon Forest Equity, LLC's application package was received by the Planning & Zoning Office and found to be substantially complete. Public notices were sent to adjacent property owners and published in the Perquimans Weekly in accordance with Section 2302 of the County's Zoning Ordinance and NC General Statutes 153A-323 and 153A-343. Pursuant to County Zoning Ordinance Section XIII, Amendments, Planning Board and BCC shall follow policy guidelines in Section 1302(A)(1-5). Planning Board action on December 11th allowed the case to be scheduled before the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) on January 7, 2019.

Recommendation Procedure: Perquimans County Zoning Ordinance Section 1301(A) provides for the Planning Board to consider the proposed rezoning at a public meeting and to make a recommendation to the BCC. In considering the request, the Planning Board and BCC shall use as a guide Sections 1302(A)(1 through 5) as summarized in the Table of Section 1302 Policy Guidelines.

Amending the map to rezone a parcel of land is a legislative decision that mandates a **legislative hearing**. The purpose of a legislative hearing is to receive broad public comment on the proposed action. The **governing board is receiving comments, not hearing evidence.** Public hearings on legislative zoning decisions must be conducted in a fair and impartial manner, but the formalities of an evidentiary hearing such as oaths, exhibits, and cross-examinations are not needed.

<u>Consistency with 2005-2006 Land Use Plan Update</u>: According to the Projected Future Land Use map Exhibit IX-B, page IX-36 of CAMA's 2005 Land Use Plan Update, the subject area is zoned **Residential with a PUD Additional Area of Interest**. The Land Use Plan Update may be viewed in its entirety on the County website at <u>www.PerquimansCountyNC.gov</u> (click on "Departments" then "Planning and Zoning" then scroll to the bottom of the page and click on "Perquimans County 2015 Joint CAMA Land Use Plan Update-Recertified 4-26-2017").

Land use classifications in the CAMA Core Land Use Plan include the following categories:

- Residential (which generally encompasses Perquimans County zoning designations: RA-43 residential and agricultural; RA-25 residential and agricultural; RA-15 residential and agricultural; and PUD);
- Commercial (which generally includes Perquimans County zoning designation: CR rural commercial; CN neighborhood commercial; and CH highway commercial);
- Additional Area of Interest : Approved (developing) planned unit development (PUD) or conditional use development (CUD) areas

Page IX-28 of the CAMA Land Use Plan narrates under Residential (a):

The County's goals and policies support the use of land in medium/high density classified areas for single family, **mixed-use**, and planned unit development where adequate public utilities and roads are available or can be upgraded to support higher residential densities.

Page IX-29 of the CAMA Land Use Plan narrates under Residential Agricultural (b):

The residential agricultural classification is compatible with the **RA-Rural Agriculture** and HA-Historic Agriculture zoning districts. These zoning districts are primarily intended to accommodate low density residential uses as well as associated public and institutional uses, low intensity commercial uses, and agricultural-related uses characterized as rural in nature.

Page IX-32 of the CAMA Land Use Plan narrates under Commercial (e):

The County's goals and policies support the use of land in the commercial classified areas for a variety of retail and commercial service uses where adequate public utilities and roads are available.

Page IX-34 of the CAMA Land Use Plan narrates under (5) Approved (developing) planned unit development (PUD) or conditional use development (CUD) areas

These are areas wherein specific development requirements –negotiated and agreed to by the County and the developer – have been (or will be) imposed as a condition(s) to development of the affected tracts and parcels within the respective PUD or CUD.

General Land Use Plan Objectives on page II-17 of the CAMA Land Use Plan are stated as follows: "The land use plan should help the County: preserve its rural character; protect and preserve the natural environment; provide adequate public facilities and services; achieve support and consensus for County initiatives; promote unity in its residential and commercial communities; and, make infrastructure improvements that compliment but do not duplicate existing systems."

Recommendations

Planning Board found proposed rezoning REZ-18-02 to be consistent and in harmony with the county comprehensive Land Use Plan existing development pattern because it is in accordance with the plans of our County and meets all the County guidelines. They recommend approval of REZ-18-02 rezoning a 2.53 acre portion of Tax Parcel No. 2-0082-0014A, from RA to CR, contingent upon:

1) recording the proposed parcel's metes and bounds and recording an abbreviated subdivision plat that mimics the exhibit map for Glandon Forest Equity by Jason Mizelle, PLS dated November 30, 2018 stored in Planning Office file REZ-18-02,

2) the applicant meeting with the residents on the other side of the berm to resolve store issues brought up in the Planning Board public meeting, [staff note: this has already occurred]

3) Dollar General installing outside security cameras for the parking lot and a camera pointed to the boat trailer parking in back,

adopting Policy Guidelines from Zoning Ordinance Section 1302(A) (1 through 5) to support the motion.

Planning Staff believes rezoning the 2.53 acre portion of the subject parcel from RA to CR will meet Zoning Ordinance Section 13 and Section 23 rules and guidelines. Planner Money suggests using a **6 month deadline** to get an abbreviated plat recorded if the rezoning is approved. Should the 6 month deadline not be met, the applicant may request an administrative extension by contacting the County Planning Office. Staff reminds the Boards to give a reason 'why' the rezoning is or is not consistent and in harmony with the surrounding area.

Suggested Motions - Recommendations - Actions:

The Board of Commissioners is requested to consider using one of the following sets of scripts to form the desired motion for approval or denial of Rezoning Request REZ-18-02, as follows:

TWO (2) SUGGESTED ACTIONS TO RECOMMEND APPROVAL:

1) <u>MOTION TO FIND PROPOSED REZONING NO. REZ-18-02</u> to be consistent and in harmony with the county comprehensive Land Use Plan existing development pattern <u>because</u> (*explain why*);

Possible reasons:

- **Current** RA zoning is compatible with the Land Use Plan Residential Agricultural classification which allows low intensity commercial uses.
- Private sewer and County water are available.
- Future Land Use Plan classification of Residential allows for mixed-use development.
- All Development of the parcel would be subject to site plan requirements of Zoning Ordinance Article V, section 509.

2) <u>MOTION TO RECOMMEND APPROVAL</u>: Motion to approve Rezoning No. REZ-18-02, to rezone a 2.53 acre portion of Tax Parcel No. 2-0082-0014A, from RA (Rural Agricultural District) to CR contingent upon:

1) Recording the proposed parcel's metes and bounds and recording an abbreviated subdivision plat that mimics the exhibit map for Glandon Forest Equity by Jason Mizelle, PLS dated November 30, 2018 stored in Planning Office file REZ-18-02, within 6 months, allowing an administrative extension by Planning staff.

2) Dollar General installing outside security cameras for the parking lot and a camera pointed to the boat trailer parking in back, (ask County Attorney if a project specific condition is legal on a rezoning ordinance or should the County administer it at the permit stage)

adopting Policy Guidelines from Zoning Ordinance Section 1302(A) (1 through 5) to support the motion. (see Table, below).

TWO (2) SUGGESTED ACTIONS *TO RECOMMEND DENLAL*: Motions to recommend denial to the Board of County Commissioners for Rezoning No. REZ-18-02, and adopting Policy Guidelines to support the motion (see Table, below) would utilize both of the above-noted motions stated in the negative tense.

Possible reasons it could be inconsistent and NOT in harmony:

- The Future Land Use Plan classification is Residential, which lists 'appropriate uses' as 'variety of low density single-family and agricultural uses and list commercial development as inappropriate.
- The site is not currently classified as a Planned Unit Development, hence 'mixed-use' does not apply.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 100

AN ORDINANCE OF PERQUIMANS COUNTY, STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA, AMENDING THE ZONING ATLAS OF PERQUIMANS COUNTY BY REZONING LANDS AS DESCRIBED HEREINAFTER FROM THE PRESENT ZONING CLASSIFICATION ÖF RA, RURAL AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT TO CR, RURAL COMMERCIAL DISTRICT; MAKING FINDINGS OF FACT; REQUIRING RECORDATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PERQUIMANS COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA:

WHEREAS, the development of the lands within this rezoning shall proceed in accordance with the application, dated October 22, 2018, in addition to supporting documents and statements from the applicant which are a part of File No. REZ-18-02, by GLANDON FOREST EQUITY, LLC (applicant) for PERQUIMANS DEVELOPMENT, LLC (landowner) as approved by the Board of County Commissioners, and incorporated by reference into and made part hereof this Ordinance. In the case of conflict between this application, the supporting documents, and the below described special provisions of this Ordinance, the below described provisions shall prevail.

SECTION 1. Upon consideration of the application, supporting documentation, statements from the applicant, correspondence received by the Planning and Zoning staff, recommendation of the Planning Board, and comments from the staff and the general public at the public hearing, finds as follows:

- The proposal will place all property similarly situated in the same category, or in appropriate complementary categories.
- There is convincing demonstration that all uses permitted under the proposed district classification would be in the general public interest and not merely in the interest of an individual or small group.
- 3) There is convincing demonstration that all uses permitted under the proposed district classification would be appropriate in the area included in the proposed change. (When a new district designation is assigned, and use permitted in the district is allowable, so long as it meets district requirements and not merely uses which applicants state that they intend to make the property involved).
- 4) There is convincing demonstration that the character of the neighborhood will not be materially or adversely affected by any use permitted in the proposed change.
- The proposed change is in accord with the Land Use Plan and sound planning principles.

6) The proposed rezoning will be initiated upon the recordation of the proposed parcel's metes and bounds and recording of an abbreviated subdivision plat that mimics the exhibit map for Glandon Forest Equity by Jason Mizelle, PLS dated November 30, 2018 stored in Planning Office file REZ-18-02, within 6 months of this ordinance date.

SECTION 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and enactment. This Ordinance shall be recorded in a book kept and maintained by the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of Perquimans County, North Carolina. I are the county representative on Albernarle Hospital Authority having served when Albernarle Hospital conducted its search for a better management structure which ultimately was to become ore of Sentary's Hospital

When I began my service on the ADI Board, the County was paying additional monies because of poor budget practices. As Cheirman of ADI, I was able to guide their budgeting policies and ADI new has over \$1M in reserve funds and has reduced annual payments for each of the three counties over the last several years.

Also, while a Contrainstoner, I encouraged the hiring of a code enforcement officer for Perquimans County. The Code Embecement Officer is currently doing a great job working with the Building Inspector's office resulting in the removal of dilapidated buildings and junk cars and trucks.

The BOC did have a tendency to avoid controversial issues. Taking a stand on the "S" Bridge was one of those issues. I made a motion to support the backing of "B Mod" (swing bridge) on the "S" Bridge, seconded by Matt Peeter, despite the fact that BOT wanted the least expensive option, "A Mod" (high-rise bridge). After a short discussion the motion was approved. Then I went to the Town of Winfall to have them pass a similar motion. The Town of Herford had already pased a similar matium. All entities naste their positions known to the DOT. After a short while the DOT issued a new proposal which was to build the "B Mod."

Property taxes have remained relatively flat with no great increases. We are still the lowest tax rate in Northeast NC.

While chairing the Fourism Development Authority, we hired a Tocrism Director who has worked to diligently improve the visibility and image of Perguintans County and to support many events and activities hosted by other county organizations as well. I think that what Straton Smith has done so far is a nully great start. But the offectiveness of the position is limited because of a lack of hotel-model options resulting in limited "lodging tax" funds collected which are the only available manies to support the position. I an asking the Commissioners to consider pulsing the position on the County payroli in your 2019 budget deliberations so that all the TDA funds can be used to support the mission of the TDA.

Finally, I would like to say that the Commissioners used to be more visible at the various functions and events that do occur in the county. I have often been the only Commissioners at many of the functions along with Frank Heath. I feel that commissioners need to do better at this. These events and organizations are the life blood of the county and deserve your attention.

And a bage thank you to Mary, Tracy and Rhenda for all of their assistance. And Frank i woold like to thank you for all of your heip, And keep those street signs straight!

- > The building is a County owned building not a Town of Hertford owned building, and the County maintains the building and pays for the maintenance of the building and the equipment.
- This would expose the County to liability issues in case of an accident by persons that are not under our ≻ employment.
- > As County Manager, Mr. Heath has oversight over county employees using the facility. He does not know all the Town of Hertford employees and he cannot control them if they come to our facility. It is after hours so the facility is not manned by a County employee during those times. It would be difficult for the county to oversee their activities,

Commissioner Hoffler asked if individuals would come to the back door to access the exercise room. Mr. Heath said that any County employees, not family members, are given a code to access the building from the back door. T. Kyle Jones made a motion to respectfully deny the Hertford Town Council's request to allow the Town of Hertford employees to use the Exercise Room at the Senior Center per the reasons cited by County Manager Heath above. The motion was seconded by Joseph W. Hoffier. The following matters were discussed:

- Commissioner Hoffler: Mr. Hoffler stated that he feels that this places County Manager Heath in a bad position.
- Commissioner Lennon: Mr. Lennon asked if the Town of Hertford had given us an approximate number of employees that would be using the exercise room facility. Mr. Heath said that the letter only stated to allow the Town of Hertford employees.
- Commissioner Jones: Mr. Jones said that his job takes him into six other counties in the district and this request is very unusual.
- Chairman Nelson: Mr. Nelson stated that opening the center for County employees is like a benefit from the County. He further stated that it isn't a multi-agency facility. It is basically a wellness facility that we can offer our employees as a benefit. We have control over our employees. He feels that it is not set up or designed for this type of use. Where would you draw the line with allowing people to use the facility.

There being no further questions or comments, the motion was unanimously approved by the Board.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 100

AN ORDINANCE OF PERQUIMANS COUNTY, STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA, AMENDING THE ZONING ATLAS OF PERQUIMANS COUNTY BY REZONING LANDS AS DESCRIBED HEREINAFTER FROM THE PRESENT ZONING CLASSIFICATION OF RA. RURAL AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT TO CR. RURAL COMMERCIAL DISTRICT; MAKING FINDINGS OF FACT; REQUIRING RECORDATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PERQUIMANS COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA:

WHEREAS, the development of the lands within this rezoning shall proceed in accordance with the application, dated October 22, 2018, in addition to supporting documents and statements from the applicant which are a part of File No. REZ-18-02, by GLANDON FOREST EQUITY, LLC (applicant) for PERQUIMANS DEVELOPMENT, LLC (landowner) as approved by the Board of County Commissioners, and incorporated by reference into and made part hereof this Ordinance. In the case of conflict between this application, the supporting documents, and the below described special provisions of this Ordinance, the below described provisions shall prevail.

SECTION 1. Upon consideration of the application, supporting documentation, statements from the applicant, correspondence received by the Planning and Zoning staff, recommendation of the Planning Board, and comments from the staff and the general public at the public hearing, finds as follows:

- 1) The proposal will place all property similarly situated in the same category, or in appropriate complementary categories.
- There is convincing demonstration that all uses permitted under the proposed district classification would be in the general public interest and not merely in the interest of an individual or small group.

- 3) There is convincing demonstration that all uses permitted under the proposed district classification would be appropriate in the area included in the proposed change. (When a new district designation is assigned, and use permitted in the district is allowable, so long as it meets district requirements and not merely uses which applicants state that they intend to make the property involved).
- 4) There is convincing demonstration that the character of the neighborhood will not be materially or adversely affected by any use permitted in the proposed change.
- 5) The proposed change is in accord with the Land Use Plan and sound planning principles.
- 6) The proposed rezoning will be initiated upon the recordation of the proposed parcel's metes and bounds and recording of an abbreviated subdivision plat that mimics the exhibit map for Glandon Forest Equity by Jason Mizelle, PLS dated November 30, 2018 stored in Planning Office file REZ-18-02, within 6 months of this ordinance date.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and enactment. This Ordinance shall be recorded in a book kept and maintained by the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of Perquimans County, North Carolina. § 143-318.11. Closed sessions.

(a) Permitted Purposes. - It is the policy of this State that closed sessions shall be held only when required to permit a public body to act in the public interest as permitted in this section. A public body may hold a closed session and exclude the public only when a closed session is required:

- (1) To prevent the disclosure of information that is privileged or confidential pursuant to the law of this State or of the United States, or not considered a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the General Statutes.
- (2) To prevent the premature disclosure of an honorary degree, scholarship, prize, or similar award.
- (3) To consult with an attorney employed or retained by the public body in order to preserve the attorney-client privilege between the attorney and the public body, which privilege is hereby acknowledged. General policy matters may not be discussed in a closed session and nothing herein shall be construed to permit a public body to close a meeting that otherwise would be open merely because an attorney employed or retained by the public body is a participant. The public body may consider and give instructions to an attorney concerning the handling or settlement of a claim, judicial action, mediation, arbitration, or administrative procedure. If the public body has approved or considered a settlement, other than a malpractice settlement by or on behalf of a hospital, in closed session, the terms of that settlement shall be reported to the public body and entered into its minutes as soon as possible within a reasonable time after the settlement is concluded.
- (4) To discuss matters relating to the location or expansion of industries or other businesses in the area served by the public body, including agreement on a tentative list of economic development incentives that may be offered by the public body in negotiations. The action approving the signing of an economic development contract or commitment, or the action authorizing the payment of economic development expenditures, shall be taken in an open session.
- (5) To establish, or to instruct the public body's staff or negotiating agents concerning the position to be taken by or on behalf of the public body in negotiating (i) the price and other material terms of a contract or proposed contract for the acquisition of real property by purchase, option, exchange, or lease; or (ii) the amount of compensation and other material terms of an employment contract or proposed employment contract.
- (6) To consider the qualifications, competence, performance, character, fitness, conditions of appointment, or conditions of initial employment of an individual public officer or employee or prospective public officer or employee; or to hear or investigate a complaint, charge, or grievance by or against an individual public officer or employee. General personnel policy issues may not be considered in a closed session. A public body may not consider the qualifications, competence, performance, character, fitness, appointment, or removal of a member of the public body or another body and may not consider or fill a vacancy among its own membership except in an open meeting. Final action making an appointment or discharge or removal by a public body having final authority for the appointment or discharge or removal shall be taken in an open meeting.
- (7) To plan, conduct, or hear reports concerning investigations of alleged criminal misconduct.
- (8) To formulate plans by a local board of education relating to emergency response to incidents of school violence or to formulate and adopt the school safety components of school improvement plans by a local board of education or a school improvement team.
- (9) To discuss and take action regarding plans to protect public safety as it relates to existing or potential terrorist activity and to receive briefings by staff members, legal counsel, or law enforcement or emergency service officials concerning actions taken or to be taken to respond to such activity.
- (b) Repealed by Session Laws 1991, c. 694, s. 4.

(c) Calling a Closed Session. - A public body may hold a closed session only upon a motion duly made and adopted at an open meeting. Every motion to close a meeting shall cite one or more of the permissible purposes listed in subsection (a) of this section. A motion based on subdivision (a)(1) of this section shall also state the name or citation of the law that renders the information to be discussed privileged or confidential. A motion based on subdivision (a)(3) of this section shall identify the parties in each existing lawsuit concerning which the public body expects to receive advice during the closed session.
