The NC Forest Service responded to 19 fire calls in FY19-20. Twelve of these were reportable wildfires, burning 7.74 acres. A field fire that humed into the woode on Basch Springs Road accounted for 4.5 of the 7.74 acres burned. Abrust all of our fires were caused by either debris burning, tractor use, or read vehicles. These wildfires did not demage or destroy any structures.

The Volunteer Fice Departments continue to be a transmoore easet in withfire suppression. Their quick initial anacks minimize for damage and keep first small. We also assisted them, as well as the Department of Transportation, in road clearing operations following Hurricans Floresce.

Forest Management

FV19-20 was a good year for farest management in Perquimans Costsy. We prepared 15 numugement plans covering 162 acres. There plans help landowners meet financial and personal objectives for their timberland. Typical plans address timber resources, wildlife, aesthetics, water quality, soil protection, and/or recreation opportunities. Through our Forest Development Program, we were able to get landowners \$1734 through our there.

Using information in their management plans, Perquimens landowners planted 158 acres of woodland.

Water Quality Protection

The NCFS is commissed to recommending and practicing onvironmentally responsible forestry operations. All forestry activities must schere to Forest Practice Guidelines and Best Management Practices. These is and regulations protect water quality and narvesting activities for 1101 acres, and found zero violations.

Information and Education

Informational and educational programs are a vital and popular part of our work here in Perquiruans. Each year, the NC Foress Service conducts educational programs an the environment, fire safety, fire prevention, tree identification, and forest stowardship. These programs are given to a broad audiesce, including onbool obliders, Rurinen, Future Formers of America, 4-educational programs in the county, Unfortunately, because of COV(D-19 restrictions, we were unable to perform any outreach events in the final quarter of the year.

LEE DUNCAN, GENERAL MANAGER OF ALBEMARLE PLANTATION

After introducing his staff that was present tonight, Mr. Duncan explained that he came tonight to present the proposed Yeopim River and Yeopim Creek Channel Dredging Project. He is asking that the County consider being a sponsor for the grant. He then asked if the Board had any questions. The following questions were asked:

- Commissioner Lennon: Mr. Lennon asked what the county would do as a sponsor. Mr. Duncan said that the state would give the money to the county to administer
- Commissioner Woodard: Mr. Woodard asked what the timeline was for this application. Mr. Duncan said that ≽ they have two windows of opportunity to apply: January 1, 2021 and July 1, 2021.

There being no further questions asked, Chairman Nelson confirmed that what he was asking for tonight was a consensus of the Board to authorize County Manager Heath and Mr. Duncan to meet and prepare documents that needed to be completed and bring back to the Board for any action. County Manager Heath asked that they include Mark Powell of Albernarle RC&D. The Board agreed.

COMMISSIONER'S CONCERNS/COMMITTEE REPORTS

The following commissioner concerns/committee report was given:

- Commissioner Lennon: Commissioner Lennon had two items to mention tonight:
 - 1. Mr. Lesmon notified the Board that Sharon Smith, Tourism Director, has resigned effective November 7°. He further stoled that the Tourism Development Authority (TDA) would like to review the current constract, payments, and dates before posting advertisement to fill this position. He did notify the Board that the Occupancy Taxes are increasing. He asked if it would be possible to send a letter of appreciation to her for the job she did for the TDA. The Board agreed.
 - Several months ago, Mr. Leanon had mentioned to the Board about revisiting our current Zoning Ordinance and seeing if any changes that Chowan County made to their Zoning Ordinance with regard to the Wind Energy Facilities could possibly be changed in the Perquimans County Zoning Ordinance. He asked if we sould place it on the Nevember Work Session to discuss. Chairman Neison said that they had someone coming to present ways they could help the County collect and/or toreclose on delinquent tax accounts. We will see how it goes but, if we do not do it in November, we might be able to do it

There being no further comments or reports, Mr. Nelson proceeded with the rest of the meeting.

UPDATES FROM COUNTY MANAGER

County Manager Heath presented the following updates:

- East Coast Steel Fabrication: As the Board may have read in the newspaper, East Coast Steel Fabrication is planning to moving their facility here which should bring about 28 jobs to the County. In addition, they are planning to do an expansion of their current facility making a \$482,000 investment into the County. Governor Couper had issued a press release explaining the details. In October, the County approved resolutions supporting their application to the One NC Fund Grant from the State and a building Reuse Grant. The average salary would be \$44,800. This is an annual payroll impact of \$1.26 million.
- Marine Rasin Bids: Mr. Heath explained that the County was short in the funds to complete the project. He felt that, after the ⊳ election, he would try to see if we could get more money and reliad the project in 2021. The current bids expire on November 11". He has notified the current bidders that we will rebid the project next year if we can obtain additional funding.
- <u>COVID-19 Update</u>: The Country is continuing to take measures to keep our employees and residents safe from the virus. Currently, Perquiamans Country has 24 active cases, 233 recovered cases, and 4 deaths.
- > Zacchaeus Legal Services (ZLS, Inc.): As Chairman Nelson mentioned earlier in tonight's meeting, Zacchaeus Legal Services will be at our November Work Session to discuss tax foreclosures. Information has already been sent to the Town of Heriferd and we are hoping that we can pattner with them to use ZUS, Inc. expectise for our tax foreclosures.
- Mike Causey, NC Insurance Commissioner: Mr. Heath explained that, asst month, Mr. Causey earne to the Hertford Fire Department to present grant checks to all the fire departments to be use for new equipment. He also presented the Northeast Coordinator Year Award to Jewel Winslow for the SHEP Program which helps seniors with their health care insurance needs.
- Sentara Albemarte Medical Center: Mr. Heally explained that Sentara Albemarke Medical Center had contacted him to explain that their officials are going through the Certificate of Needs process for some long range plazating and are looking at a replacement for the hospital. They have asked Perguimans County to write a letter of support for that Certificate of Need. He did not see a problem with it and would be willing to prepare the letter of support for this fong range plonning process.

County Manager Heath explained that this matter was received after the Agenda Packets were distributed so it could not be included under the consent agenda. On motion made by Joseph W. Hoffler, seconded by Charles Woodard, the resignation of Califyn Colson, EMS Shift Supervisor (Paramedic) was unanimously approved effective November 23, 2020.

APPOINTMENT: AT-LARGE REPRESENTATIVE TO ALBEMARLE COMMISSION BOARD

County Manager Heath explained that we have received a letter from Albemarle Commission requesting that Perquimans County appoint an at-large representative to the Albemarle Commission Board effective January 1, 2021. This person will serve for two (2) years and the at-large representative cannot be an elected official. He is bringing this before the Board tonight for them to think about who they would like to appoint and the Board will take action on it at their December 7th meeting. No action was necessary at this time.

Perquimans County Planning & Zoning Staff Report By Rhonda Money, Planner For BCC Meeting December 7, 2020

SUBJECT: N.C. General Statute Chapter 160D Regulation Update for Perquimans County.

Why it is needed— Chapter 160D consolidates and reorganizes the Articles of Planning & Regulation of Development in current Article 18, Chapter 153A for counties and Article 19, Chapter 160A for municipalities. It also repeals these existing statutes as of January 1, 2021. This reorganization was initiated by the Zoning and Land Use Section of the N.C. Bar Association in 2013. In 2019, after six years of discussions and Senate and House failures, the General Assembly finally adopted a bill that combined the Chapter 160D bill (S.422) with a set of statutory amendments proposed by the N.C. Home Builders Association (S. 355).

<u>When it is effective</u> -- The effective date of Chapter 160D has changed several times from Jan 1, 2021 to August 1, 2021 due to COVID-19 uncertainty, then to June **19**, **2020** which is the current effective date (S.L. 2020-25). As it stands now, Chapter 160D is in effect if your local regulations have already been updated. The official deadline to update is January 1, 2021, but due to COVID-19, the General Assembly is allowing local governments an extra six months, to July 1, 2021 to bring their regulations into conformity.

"Local governments can enact their amendments now, but they are not required to do so until July 1, 2021." David Owens, Coates' Canons Blog: Chapter 160D Now Effective

What it encompasses — Perquimans County's Manufactured Home Park Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations, and Zoning Ordinance need to be edited for issues such as:

- References to G.S. Chapters 160A or 153A will need to reference appropriate 160D sections
- Terminology must be updated to match 160D terms, such as Conditional Zoning (vs. Conditional Use District) and Special Use Permit (vs. Conditional Use Permit).
- Definitions for building, dwelling, dwelling unit, bedroom, and sleeping unit must be consistent with definitions in state law.
- New staff conflict-of-interest standards must be incorporated into regulations.
- Must adopt comprehensive plan updates using legislative decision procedures.
- Must reasonably maintain a comprehensive plan.
- Conditional-use-district zoning must be eliminated: existing CUD zoning converts to conditional zoning district on January 1, 2021.
- For a future land use map that is deemed amended, if it is a CAMA plan, then such amendment is not effective until it goes through the CAMA plan-amendment process

- Parties with standing must be allowed to participate fully in an evidentiary hearing, including presenting evidence, cross-examining witnesses, objecting to evidence, and making legal arguments.
- Multi-phase developments must be recognized long-term projects of at least 25 acres with vesting up to seven years, except for specified exceptions.
- Be aware that a court *shall* award attorneys' fees if the court finds that a city or county violated a statute or case law setting forth unambiguous limits on its authority.

Now is also the opportune moment to make minor text amendments, such as incorporating 2017 legislation into our subdivision regulations (street maintenance bonds).

<u>How to implement</u> — Due to the extensive time required in the nature of the task, more personnel is needed to complete the project by the required deadline.

Subcontractor, Holland Consulting Planners, has submitted a proposal to re-write/update the Perquimans County zoning, subdivision, and manufactured home park ordinances for a proposed fee not to exceed seventeen thousand five hundred dollars (\$17,500). The proposal is based on the following considerations:

- County staff will provide a list of edits/corrections which should be made to the Zoning Ordinance.
- The Subdivision Regulations will be updated to ensure compliance with all NCGS requirements, including NCGS 160D and road maintenance bonds.
- Revisions to the manufactured home park ordinance for compliance with NCGS 160D.
- There will be one (1) meeting with the Planning Board, one (1) work session with the Board of Commissioners, and attendance at a public hearing.
- Landin Holland will be the Project Manager and primary contact.
- Delivery to the County of an electronic copy of all revised ordinances.

Attached is an updated Annual Report by Kara W. Price regarding the status and progress made on Conditional Use Permit No. CUP-19-03 to construct a solar energy system on tax parcel number 2-0061-0076A currently owned by T.A. Newbold Miller, LLC located at the northernmost end of Pender Road, close to Harvey Point Road.

Ms. Price is requesting a one, or preferably two year CUP extension. According to Perquimans County Zoning Ordinance section 309(c) a vested right is established with approval of a CUP and shall remain vested for 2 years. The County may extend the vested term to a maximum of five years.

Background Reference:

Condition 'N' titled 'Annual Reports' in CUP-19-03 in Perquimans County Register of Deeds book 493, page 294 states, "...During construction of the project, the Applicant, heirs and assigns shall provide the County with annual reports outlining progress to date along with circumstances that may result in delays. In the event construction will be delayed beyond <u>December 31, 2020</u>, the Applicant, heirs and assigns shall formally request an extension be granted by the Board of County Commissioners; otherwise the BCC may revoke the Conditional Use Permit."

This letter concerns the above reference Conditional Use Permit officially issued to Perquimans Solar, LLC as of the date October 7, 2019 (the "CUP"). Pursuant to Section N of the CUP, Perquimans Solar LLC formally requests an extension of the CUP for at least one year, specifically the time in which to begin construction on the project from December 31, 2020 to, preferably, December 31, 2022.

Perquimans Solar, LLC has diligently prepared to begin and complete construction on the project throughout 2020. Unfortunately, construction has not been able to proceed due to unanticipated interconnection delays with Dominion Energy and will be delayed beyond December 31, 2020. There is a large electric customer in the area that is expected to go offline in late 2021/early 2022. Due to issues with transmission capacity, the project will become fully financially feasible for commercial operation after the large customer has gone off-line. These delays are further compounded by the impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic which has had a negative impact on the underlying conditions for proceeding with the Project such as the conditions for construction as well as impacts to financial markets and financing conditions.

Accordingly, Perquimans Solar, LLC respectfully requests that the Board of County Commissioners, pursuant to Section N of the CUP, grant an extension of the CUP of at least a year or more, and preferably, up to and including December 31, 2022, in which to begin construction. The vote of any county in good standing may be cast by any one of its County Commissioners who is present at the time the vote is taken; provided, if no commissioner be present, such vote may be cast by another county official, elected or appointed, who holds elective office or an appointed position in the county whose vote is being cast and who is formally designated by the Board of County Commissioners. These provisions shall likewise govern district meetings of the Association. A county in good standing is defined as one which has paid the current year's dues."

§ 143-318.11. Closed sessions.

(a) Permitted Purposes. - It is the policy of this State that closed sessions shall be held only when required to permit a public body to act in the public interest as permitted in this section. A public body may hold a closed session and exclude the public only when a closed session is required:

- (1) To prevent the disclosure of information that is privileged or confidential pursuant to the law of this State or of the United States, or not considered a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the General Statutes.
- (2) To prevent the premature disclosure of an honorary degree, scholarship, prize, or similar award.
- (3) To consult with an attorney employed or retained by the public body in order to preserve the attorney-client privilege between the attorney and the public body, which privilege is hereby acknowledged. General policy matters may not be discussed in a closed session and nothing herein shall be construed to permit a public body to close a meeting that otherwise would be open merely because an attorney employed or retained by the public body is a participant. The public body may consider and give instructions to an attorney concerning the handling or settlement of a claim, judicial action, mediation, arbitration, or administrative procedure. If the public body has approved or considered a settlement, other than a malpractice settlement by or on behalf of a hospital, in closed session, the terms of that settlement shall be reported to the public body and entered into its minutes as soon as possible within a reasonable time after the settlement is concluded.
- (4) To discuss matters relating to the location or expansion of industries or other businesses in the area served by the public body, including agreement on a tentative list of economic development incentives that may be offered by the public body in negotiations. The action approving the signing of an economic development contract or commitment, or the action authorizing the payment of economic development expenditures, shall be taken in an open session.
- (5) To establish, or to instruct the public body's staff or negotiating agents concerning the position to be taken by or on behalf of the public body in negotiating (i) the price and other material terms of a contract or proposed contract for the acquisition of real property by purchase, option, exchange, or lease; or (ii) the amount of compensation and other material terms of an employment contract or proposed employment contract.
- (6) To consider the qualifications, competence, performance, character, fitness, conditions of appointment, or conditions of initial employment of an individual public officer or employee or prospective public officer or employee; or to hear or investigate a complaint, charge, or grievance by or against an individual public officer or employee. General personnel policy issues may not be considered in a closed session. A public body may not consider the qualifications, competence, performance, character, fitness, appointment, or removal of a member of the public body or another body and may not consider or fill a vacancy among its own membership except in an open meeting. Final action making an appointment or discharge or removal by a public body having final authority for the appointment or discharge or removal shall be taken in an open meeting.
- (7) To plan, conduct, or hear reports concerning investigations of alleged criminal misconduct.
- (8) To formulate plans by a local board of education relating to emergency response to incidents of school violence or to formulate and adopt the school safety components of school improvement plans by a local board of education or a school improvement team.
- (9) To discuss and take action regarding plans to protect public safety as it relates to existing or potential terrorist activity and to receive briefings by staff members, legal counsel, or law enforcement or emergency service officials concerning actions taken or to be taken to respond to such activity.
- (b) Repealed by Session Laws 1991, c. 694, s. 4.

(c) Calling a Closed Session. - A public body may hold a closed session only upon a motion duly made and adopted at an open meeting. Every motion to close a meeting shall cite one or more of the permissible purposes listed in subsection (a) of this section. A motion based on subdivision (a)(1) of this section shall also state the name or citation of the law that renders the information to be discussed privileged or confidential. A motion based on subdivision (a)(3) of this section shall identify the parties in each existing lawsuit concerning which the public body expects to receive advice during the closed session.
