The Perquimans County Board of Commissioners met in a Special Called Meeting on Monday, June 25, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Room located in the Perquimans County Courthouse Annex. The purpose of the meeting was to hold Public Hearing for the FY 2012-2013 Budget.

Chairman Hobbs called the meeting to order and gave the invocation. He then led the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Hobbs explained that, the purpose of this meeting tonight was to hold a Public Hearing for FY 2012-2013 Budget.

AGENDA

The Agenda, as amended, was unanimously approved on motion made by Mack E. Nixon, seconded by Edward R. Muzzulin.

PUBLIC HEARING

FY 2012-2013 Budget

Chairman Hobbs opened the Public Hearing stating that the purpose of the public hearing was to receive public comments on the proposed FY 2012-2013 Budget. There were four (4) people present. The Chairman recognized County Manager Frank Heath who reviewed the following changes to the Budget that was presented at the June 4, 2012 meeting. Those changes were as follows:

General Fund – Sheriff's Department

- Decrease State Grants Law Enforcement Revenue in the amount of \$87,254
- EXPLANATION: Sheriff did not receive the grant that he applied for that would have covered a new vehicle, computer equipment in patrol cars, and other safety equipment.

General Fund – Extension Services

- $\bullet \;$ Increase in State Grant Voluntary Ag District in the amount of \$297
- EXPLANATION: Extension Services received additional funding for the Voluntary Ag District.

Chairman Hobbs asked if there were any comments/questions from the Board or from the public. The following comments/questions were made:

- > Cathy Wilson: Ms. Wilson asked how the reduction in the Sheriff's budget would affect his department. Mr. Heath explained that it would mean that he would not get an additional vehicle, computer equipment in patrol cars, and other safety equipment.
- Chairman Hobbs: Mr. Hobbs asked about the maintenance of the Board of Elections voting machines and if it was included in the budget since the State has not adopted their budget yet. Mr. Heath said that it was included in our budget at this time.

There being no further questions or comments from the Board and/or public, the Chairman closed the Public Hearing at 7:10 p.m. and proceeded with the Special Called Meeting.

FY 2011-2012 YEAR-END BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Mr. Heath explained that Budget Amendment numbers 29 through 32 have been prepared to balance the current year's budget and to budget for items just brought to his attention: Commissioner Muzzulin asked if this meant that these departments were over spent. Mr. Heath and Sharon Ward, Finance Officer, explained that only two departments were overspent: (1) the Register of Deeds' Office because of the Conveyance Tax which was a result of State legislation; and (2) Legal Fees which probably had to do with the Wind Farm Project. On motion made by Edward R. Muzzulin, seconded by Tammy Miller-White, the Board unanimously approved the following Budget Amendment Numbers 29 through 32:

XI. TAX LEVY

Section 1: There is hereby levied a tax at the rate of 44¢ (forty-four) per one hundred dollars (\$100) valuation of property listed for taxes as of January 1, 2013 for the purpose of raising the revenue listed as "Budget Year's Taxes" in the General Fund - Part I, Section 2 of this Ordinance.

Section 2: This rate of tax is based on an estimated total valuation of property for the purpose of taxation of \$1,642,807,013 and an estimated collection rate of 96.44%.

This Budget was approved with a vote of six (6) to zero (0) on June 25, 2012 by a quorum of the Perquimans County Board of Commissioners being present and all present casting a vote.
