RESPOND NOW TO THE 2020 CENSUS

Time is running out to complete the 2020 Census and your community stands to lose hundreds of millions of dollars in federal funding over the next 10 years if you aren't counted.

Whether you're unsure what the 2020 Census is or you're apprehensive about participating, please know that your participation is vital to your community receiving federal funding for services you use every day.

If you care about your community getting its fair share of funding to improve the school your child attends, the roads you drive on, and securing sufficient funding for Medicaid and food assistance programs, you need to respond NOW.

Take 10 minutes out of your day and go to **my2020census.gov** now or call **1-844-330-2020** to count yourself and everyone in your household. If you receive a visit from a census taker, please cooperate as the responses you provide are protected by law and cannot be shared with any person or government entity.

Contact all your family members, friends, neighbors, co-workers, and others to ensure their households has responded as well. It takes all of us!

HOW TO IDENTIFY A CENSUS TAKER

To Ensure EVERYONE is counted, Census takers are visiting households that have not yet responded to the 2020 Census to collect their responses in person.



PPE MASK

All Census takers are required to wear a PPE mask.



2020 CENSUS BADGE

Census employees will possess an authentic work badge with logo and employee's name.



2020 CENSUS PHONE

Census employees will possess an iPhone® with Census logo on back.



U.S. CENSUS TOTE BAG

Census employees will carry a tote bag with the Census logo on it.

If no one is home, Census takers will leave a Notice of Visit with info on how to respond.
