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ALBEMARLE REGIONAL HEALTH SERVICES PROVIDES UPDATE ON REGIONAL VACCINE CLINICS Updated COVID-19 vaccine counts, cases, and outbreaks

Elizabeth City, NC – Albemarle Regional Health Services (ARHS) is providing updated information on COVID-19 vaccines, lab confirmed positive COVID-19 cases, and facility outbreaks as of 1 p.m. Friday, December 17, 2021 in addition to the weekly surveillance report (attached).

"As our community prepares for the holiday season, take action now to protect yourself and your loved ones by getting your COVID-19 vaccine," states R. Battle Betts, Jr., MPA, ARHS Health Director. "To help reduce the spread of the virus this winter there are several things we can do. Before you travel or gather with others, get your vaccine, booster doses and flu shot. Get tested if you are a feeling sick and stay home if you are experiencing any symptoms. We also encourage everyone to wear a mask indoors in public, even if you are vaccinated. We are starting to see a slight increase in cases across the state, but if we act now and follow these prevention and mitigation strategies, we can hopefully avoid a large surge in cases."

ARHS continues to offer appointments for Pfizer vaccinations for ages 5 years and older, as well as Moderna and Johnson & Johnson for adults 18 and over. Appointments are available to residents of the eight-county region. Appointments are for first, second, third and booster doses. If you have received any previous COVID-19 vaccines, please bring your vaccine card with you to your appointment. Parental consent is required for children 17 and younger. Please note ARHS will be closed for the holidays on Thursday, December 23, Friday, December 24, and Monday, December 27. We will resume services on Tuesday, December 28 and 8 a.m.

COVID-19 testing is still available by appointments at the local health departments across the region. Tests will be completed through a curbside screening clinic. To schedule an appointment call your local health department directly.

ARHS is collaborating with OptumServe to provide additional, no-cost COVID-19 testing sites in Bertie, Chowan, and Hertford counties. The Pasquotank County site is no longer available. Optum sites offer PCR only tests.

Typically testing is available most days of the week however, times and days may change so please call or check the website prior to going to a site. You may check availability and register to make an appointment for testing by visiting https://lhi.care/covidtesting or by calling (877) 562-4850.

ARHS is continuing to ask our community citizens to be mindful in practicing preventive and safety measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Please remember these precautions:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom;
 before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available,
 use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Practice social distancing; stay at least six feet away from others, avoid unnecessary travel, avoid handshakes, hugs and other close contact.
- Wear a cloth face covering in public.
- Get vaccinated.
