New Resource Available - Stink Bug Scouting Guide for Field Corn in the Southeastern US

Thanks to the generous support of the Corn Growers Association of North Carolina, and the USDA CCPM program, we have learned a lot about how to manage stink bugs in corn. We recently revised our thresholds and have a good handle on how to manage them with insecticides.

Throughout this work, we have also learned how to scout for stink bugs in corn and have created this resource as an aid to proper scouting. A follow-up article will detail what we are learning about the association of crop rotation and overwintering sites in corn.

Pesticide Disposal Collection Day

North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, in cooperation with the Perquimans County Cooperative Extension, will be offering a Pesticide Collection Day for residents in Perquimans County and surrounding counties. The local site manager will be Jared Harrell, County Extension Director and Livestock Agricultural Extension Agent for Perquimans County. Collection will be Wednesday, December 6, 2023 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Southern States, 330 Ballahack Road, Hertford, NC 27944.

Nearly all pesticide products will be accepted. For liquid pesticide containers larger than 5 gal or for unlabeled pesticides, please contact the Perquimans Cooperative Extension Office for information before bringing to the collection event. No gas cylinders are accepted at the event; however, assistance information can be provided. Contact the Perquimans Cooperative Extension Office for more information. 4-H Horse Judging

Perquimans County 4-Her, Georgia Wand, had the opportunity of a lifetime in her last 4-H year. Georgia competed as a member of the NC 4-H Horse Judging Team at both the All-American Quarter Horse Congress in Ohio and the Eastern National 4-H Horse Round-Up in Kentucky.

In Ohio, Georgia's team finished 3rd Overall while also bringing home 4th overall in halter judging, 3rd overall in performance judging, and 5th overall in reasons.

In Kentucky, the team came home as the Champion Horse Judging Team! They also brought home 2nd overall in halter judging, 1st overall in performance judging, and 1st overall in oral reasons. Georgia herself was awarded 5th overall individual in performance judging, 4th overall individual in oral reasons, and 10th overall individual for the whole contest!

We are so proud of Georgia and her accomplishments!



Poinsettias

Holiday poinsettias provide shades of reds, pinks and whites to our homes during the holiday season. They often come with a warning, though; should you look but not touch? Many people believe that poinsettias are toxic to humans and pets alike and often advise pet owners and parents to steer clear. However, that is not the case. While poinsettias may be a skin irritant to those that are sensitive, they are not poisonous to humans or animals. This myth has become the subject of numerous studies where researchers have tested what dosage of the plant may be toxic to humans or animals, to which they suggest 500-600 poinsettia leaves (or bracts) could be consumed with no impacts that indicate its toxicity. Holiday Challenge

Once again, North Carolina State University and N.C. Cooperative Extension are offering the Holiday Challenge. This is an online program to help prevent

holiday weight gain. Each year many Americans gain between one and five pounds between Thanksgiving and the New Year. While this might not sound like much, this weight gain accounts for 51% of people's weight gain for the whole year. The problem is most people never manage to lose those extra pounds and year after year it adds up. It's all virtual and you can participate on your computer or cell phone. Best of all, it's FREE. This seven-week program provides strategies and resources that can help participants maintain their weight during the holiday season.

As in the past, this year's program features weekly newsletters, daily tips, healthy holiday recipes, and weekly challenges. These will all be delivered to your email inbox. Topics discussed include how to survive a holiday party, manage holiday stress, and stay active during the winter. There are also downloadable tools you can use, such as weight logs, and food and activity journals.

ServeSafe Food Safety Class



Calling all those in the restaurant and food service industry! N.C. Cooperative Extension will be offering a ServSafe Food Safety Class in July. The class will be held at the Albemarle Plantation, and will begin promptly at 9 a.m. each day. ServSafe is a course designed by the National Restaurant Association

Educational Foundation to provide food service operators, managers, and support personnel with the knowledge essential for food preparation and handling within their respective facilities to help reduce the risk of foodborne illness. The course covers handling food, from receiving and storing to preparing and serving. It gives science-based information on how to run a safe establishment.

The 14-hour class will be scheduled as follows: January 29th Instruction Day 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. January 30th Instruction Day 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. January 31st Exam Day 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.

Test Registration cost is \$125 (which includes the 7th edition book and exam sheet.)


