4-H Online Re-Enrollment

All 4-H members need to re-enroll in <u>4-HOnline</u> in order to be eligible to participate in 4-H events and activities this year.

For families with an existing 4-HOnline account, log in to your family profile and review and update youth member/volunteer information as needed. The system will walk you through each of the required sections. Some sections of the application must be completed annually while others just ask that you review areas for any needed changes. When you have updated all of the information click "Enroll". Your membership status will be updated and sent to your 4-H office for approval. The renewal process should only take a few minutes.

For families without an existing account, please take a few minutes to create a family profile in the 4-HOnline system. Once the family profile is set up you will then add individual youth and volunteer members to your family account.

4-H College Scholarships and Honor Club

Current North Carolina 4-H members who are graduating high school seniors with at least 3 years of experience in 4-H are encouraged to apply for NC 4-H college scholarships. You must have completed three or more years of 4-H club work and shall be at least 16 years of age and not more than 20 years of age on January 1 of the year of application. The total number of applicants inducted into the NC 4-H Honor Club shall be limited to .5% of the current enrollment of North Carolina 4-H members. Spring Gardens

While we are just getting into the heart of winter, it is already time to begin planning your spring garden. In a few short weeks, seed catalogs will fill the mailboxes of beginner and avid gardeners alike and big box stores will begin stocking the gloves and trowels. So, what can you do now in your home garden and landscape to prepare for the warmer days of the spring growing season?

- Plan out your garden spaces. Decide if you will be using the same spaces as last year or if it is time for a new garden space. Consider raised beds and container gardening for more accessible gardening options.
- If you are choosing a new space to garden in the ground, consider taking a soil sample. Soil sample forms and boxes are available at the Perquimans County Extension office. The soil report you receive back will give you insight to the nutrients that are available in your soil and what you can do to improve your soil.
- Decide what you want to plant. If you are wanting cool-season annuals, late February and early March is the time to plant; these include things like lettuce, carrots and radishes that thrive in temperatures below 70 degrees Fahrenheit. Warm-season annuals such as zucchini, peppers and watermelon need to be planted after the last frost, when daytime temperatures are above 70 degrees Fahrenheit, usually after the first of April.



ServeSafe Food Safety Class



Calling all those in the restaurant and food service industry! N.C. Cooperative Extension will be offering a ServSafe Food Safety Class in July. The class will be held at the Albamarle Plantation, and will begin promptly at 9 a.m. each day. ServSafe is a course designed by the National Restaurant Association

Educational Foundation to provide food service operators, managers, and support personnel with the knowledge essential for food preparation and handling within their respective facilities to help reduce the risk of foodborne illness. The course covers handling food, from receiving and storing to preparing and serving. It gives science-based information on how to run a safe establishment.

The 14-hour class will be scheduled as follows: January 29th Instruction Day 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. January 30th Instruction Day 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. January 31st Exam Day 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.
